**Mon., 10 August – St. Lawrence, Deacon and Martyr**

The year was 258 A.D. It was a difficult beginning for what would become the First Christian Millennium. Valerian, the Roman emperor heard the news and wanted the treasure to satisfy his unbridled lust for worldly power. So, he offered Deacon Lawrence a way out of sure death. If he would show him where the Church's great gold and silver were located, he would issue an order of clemency. For three days, Deacon Lawrence went throughout the city and invited all the beloved poor, handicapped, and unfortunate to come together. When Valerian arrived, Deacon Lawrence presented him with the poor! The emperor was filled with rage! He ordered Deacon Lawrence to be burned alive.
