BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

I WILL NOT **LEAVE YOU ORPHANS**

One of the most touching phrases in John's Gospel is Jesus' promise before his death that he would not leave his disciples orphans. The quality of his presence among them would change after the resurrection. In the future the Spirit would be the one instructing, strengthening, and protecting disciples. Jesus promises that whoever receives his commandments will be loved by the Father. This promise is fulfilled when the Samaritans become believers through Philip's ministry of preaching and healing. Samaritans were considered heretical Jews, but their positive reception of the word prompted the Jerusalem community to think again and to send Peter and John to welcome them into the larger community. The gift of the Spirit through the laying on of hands is the sign of God's blessing and of their full incorporation into the growing Christian family.

The first letter of Peter was written in a time of great trial and opposition. How were Christians going to respond to false charges against them? How were they able to give a credible account of their Christian faith? These early Christians were urged to remain steadfast and true to their values and belief. Like them, we are encouraged to find our source of strength in the example of Jesus who suffered and died for us even though he was innocent. It is not an easy path we are asked to tread but we are encouraged to see that our best defence is the quality of our lives and the depth of our hope.



FEAST OF THE WEEK

Wednesday, 17 May - Saint Paschal Baylon

This humble Spanish friar is known as the Saint of the Blessed Sacrament. St Pascal was a shepherd from the time he was 7 until the age of 24. He taught himself to read so that he could recite the Little Office of Our Lady. When he was about 18, he asked to join the Friars Minor at Loreto. These barefooted Franciscans, who followed the austere reforms of St Peter of Alcantara, at first rejected Paschal; but when they finally accepted him years later, Paschal's virtues stood out even among these fervent friars. An unlearned man who worked mainly as a porter or doorkeeper, Paschal acquired an understanding of

theological matters through his many hours on his knees before the Blessed Sacrament. Even after praying through the night, he eagerly served consecutive Masses beginning after dawn. St Paschal was sometimes sent on journeys through France at a time when persecution from the Huguenots made traveling dangerous for anyone in a habit, and he was stoned on more than one occasion. Many miraculous cures of the sick and poor were attributed to St Paschal even during his lifetime.
