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Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord, Year B

This Palm Sunday, we begin a vigil of Jesus' passion and death. The Palm Sunday liturgy is a practice of living and



dying well- so that when we are called to walk it, we can trust in the Resurrection that God has promised will come, even while we sit in the tomb. As we are pilgrim people, let us continue our journey of faith in this life by walking together with the children of God of all nations and all ages-ultimately tracing the footsteps of Jesus himself, that we might find life in him, through him and with him. So,

When life has you down, and hardships pile up; when the world is blue, and you are depressed, take a walk with God.

When times are good, and life is happy; when the sun does shine, and the birds are singing, give thanks to God and take a walk with Him.

Share with Him all your sorrows; Share with Him all your fears; Talk with Him as a friend as you walk with God.

A story to reflect: Often we wonder, "What did I do to deserve this?" or "Why did God have to do this to me?"

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

This Sunday's Readings



Entrance Antiphon:

Hosanna to the Son of David; blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, the King of Israel Hosanna in the highest. I will proclaim your name to my brethren; in the midst of the assembly I will praise you: "You who fear the LORD, praise him; all you descendants of Jacob, give glory to him; revere him, all you descendants of Israel!" First Reading: Isaiah 50:4-7

I did not cover my face against insult: I know I shall not be shamed

The Lord has given me a disciple's tongue. So that I may know how to reply to the wearied he provides me with speech. Each morning he wakes me to hear, to listen like a disciple. The Lord has opened my ear. For my part, I made no resistance, neither did I turn away. I offered my back to those who struck me, my cheeks to those who tore at my beard; I did not cover my face against insult and spittle. The Lord comes to my help, so that I am untouched by the insults. So, too, I set my face like flint;

I know I shall not be shamed.

Responsorial Psalm: 21: 8-9, 17-20, 23-24

R. My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?

All who see me scoff at me; they mock me with parted lips, they wag their heads: "He relied on the LORD; let him deliver him, let him rescue him, if he loves him." R.

Second Reading: Philippians 2:6-11 Christ humbled himself but God raised him high

His state was divine, yet Christ Jesus did not cling to his equality with God but emptied himself to assume the condition of a slave and became as men are; and being as all men are, he was humbler yet, even to accepting death, death on a cross. But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all other names so that all beings in the heavens, on earth and in the underworld, should bend the knee at the name of Jesus and that every tongue should acclaim Jesus Christ as Lord,

Memory completed her vocational training course in carpentry and joinery.
