
"Jeremy was born with a twisted body and a slow mind. At the age of 12 he was still in second grade, seemingly unable to learn. His teacher, Doris Miller, often became

exasperated with him for Jeremy just irritated his teacher. One day she called his parents and asked them if they could take the child. They too were helpless. As she pondered the situation and prayed to the Lord, please help me to be more patient with Jeremy. One day, he limped to her desk, dragging his bad leg behind him." I love you, Miss Miller," he exclaimed. The other students snickered, and Doris' face turned red. But he just looked.

As Easter approached, Doris told them the story of Jesus, and then to emphasize the idea of new life springing forth, she gave each of the children a large plastic egg and told them to bring a symbol of new life. All the children responded enthusiastically-all except for Jeremy. He listened intently; his eyes never left her face. He did not even make his usual noises. The next morning, 19 children came to school, laughing and talking as they placed their eggs in the large wicker basket on Miss Miller's desk. Then it was time to open the eggs. In the first egg, Doris found a flower. "Oh yes, a flower is certainly a sign of new life," she said. The next egg contained a plastic butterfly. Yes, that's new life, too from caterpillar to butterfly. Next, Doris found a rock with moss on it which too, showed life. Then Doris opened the fourth egg. She



gasped. The egg was empty. Surely it must be Jeremy's she thought, and he did not understand. She quietly set the egg aside and reached for another. Suddenly, Jeremy spoke up. "Miss Miller, aren't you going to talk about my egg?" Doris replied, "But Jeremy, your egg is empty." He looked into her eyes and said softly, "Yes, but Jesus' tomb was empty, too." Doris asked him, "Do you know why the tomb was empty?" "Oh, yes," Jeremy said, "Jesus was killed and put in there. Then His Father raised Him up." Miss Miller knew all was different. She just cried. She now understood the child on the verge of death. Three months later, Jeremy died. Those who paid their respects at the mortuary were surprised to see 19 eggs on top of his casket, all of them empty".




God's blessings

The stone rolled away and the empty tomb – one of the witnesses testifying to the resurrection of Jesus. Resurrection of Jesus is God's vindication of his incredible life. Our challenges, difficulties and circumstances look different today unlike Jeremy's in the story. And, in the midst of whatever trials we may be facing, the risen Christ offers us his steady peace, which helps us to keep on believing in good and that we will rise to a new heaven and a new earth: sharing the blessings with the impoverished;

celebrating the differences in humanity with a sense of belonging and solidarity; terminating the baseless wars; reconciling with one another and accepting one another with one's strengths and liabilities; creating a safe and secure planet for the budding generation; living in unity, understanding and sincere love in the families, Yep, that is the HOPE that Easter Sunday instils in every one of us. But at the same time, it invites us for action too. There can be no waiting this time for the resurrected Jesus to roll away the stone. These stones can only be removed by us. The power of the resurrected Jesus is within us! What is the one stone that I roll away this Easter?

Entrance Antiphon:

First Reading: *Acts 10: 34,37-43*

We have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: 'You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil. Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses - we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead - and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.'

Responsorial Psalm: Ps 117: 1-2,16-17,22-23

R: This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad.

Give thanks to the Lord for He is good, For his love has no end. Let the sons of Israel say: 'His love has no end'. R

The Lord's right hand has triumphed; His right hand raised me up. I shall not die, I shall live And recount his deeds. **R**

Second Reading: Colossians 3: 1-4 Look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is.

Since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is, sitting at God's right hand. Let your thoughts be on heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth, because you have died, and now the life you have is hidden with Christ in God. But when Christ is revealed – and he is your life – you too will be revealed in all your glory with him.

Gospel: John 20: 1-9 He must rise from the dead

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.'

So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.

Communion Antiphon:


