"Food is a gift of God given to all creatures for the purposes of life's nurture, sharing, and celebration.

When it is done in the name of God, eating is the earthly realization of God's eternal

communion-building love".

"The readings for the 3rd Sunday in Easter encourage us to truly believe in the resurrection of Jesus Christ and to accept his love. In the gospel the risen Jesus appears to his disciples and helps them understand his death and resurrection by sharing a meal and explaining the scripture prophecies about his suffering, resurrection and affirming their roles as witnesses.

A chat over a meal could transform one's life, and that is what happened in the encounter of Jesus with the two of his earliest followers (Disciples of Emmaus). Their hospitality led to a theophany. The normality of eating gave the disciples overwhelming joy and the experience of the risen Jesus.

Now, the disbelief, fear, frightand every negative feeling is gone in the hearts and minds of the disciples. Commenting on Jesus revealing himself at the dinner table, Jessica Brodie says that there is something relaxing about the fellowship of the table. There, "people are calm, unhurried, there to fill their bellies and rest after a hard day. It is a place of intimacy and friendship, a place where relationships are strengthened. Perhaps this is a metaphor for the church and the sort of evangelism Jesus knew would spread best — rooted in relationships, person to person. Second, the table is a "regular" place, a fixture of daily life. Perhaps this represents the way Jesus wants people to know Him:



on a basic, core, everyday level, practical and authentic, not fancy, or fussy or only for a certain class or rank."

The disciples now energized, embark on a journey of sharing the experience for the rest of their lives. This is what happens in the breaking of bread in the Mass as we gather around the altar with all our mixed feelings and experiences. We are healed, nourished, transformed, and renewed. Jesus comes to us, and we are filled with energy and new possibility, and the joy of the resurrection. We can have a new life, and we can be born again and again right now at any venue. Let us keep moving and chart new adventures, because Jesus walks beside us on the road of life's journey.

"In our lives the common cup of coffee or tea can often be a time to think, to assess, to regroup, to regain control, to reestablish a relationship, to deepen a friendship, to listen, or to offer advice. It can be the space in which we begin to process very good or very bad news, attend to hurt feelings, overcome feelings of revenge or anger, and quietly celebrate an achievement. It can also be a moment of reflection or prayer. Tea and coffee are often more than just caffeine shots." Do our family meals or any such table fellowship lead us to recognise the powerful and loving presence of Jesus in our midst?



A teacher was once speaking to her students about the Eucharist. She asked the students which was, in their opinion, the most important part of the Mass. Without batting an eyelid, one student replied, "The Dismissal- Go, the Mass is ended!" Initially the teacher thought the student was joking, but he was absolutely serious and meant just what he said. So, the teacher asked him to explain, and this is his answer: "The whole purpose of the Mass is to nourish us spiritually -first, with God's Word in the Liturgy of the Word, and second, with God's Life in the Liturgy of the Eucharist, culminating in the Holy Communion.

And God nourishes us so that we can go forth and bear witness to Him by our lives, our words and our actions."

The teacher was impressed and urged the student to continue. And so, he added, "The Eucharist does not end with the Dismissal Rite. On the contrary, it begins there. (James Valladares and other sources are duly acknowledged).

Let our lives proclaim that Jesus is the true, living God among us!

This Sunday's Readings

Entrance Antiphon:

Let all the earth cry out to God with joy; praise the glory of his name; proclaim his glorious praise. Alleluia.

First Reading: Acts 3: 13-15, 17-19

You have killed the prince of life; God, however, raised him from the dead.

Peter said to the people: 'You are Israelites, and it is the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, the God of our ancestors, who has glorified his servant Jesus, the same Jesus you handed over and then disowned in the presence of Pilate after Pilate had decided to release him. It was you who accused the Holy One, the Just One, you who demanded the reprieve of a murderer while you killed the prince of life. God, however, raised him from the dead, and to that fact we are the witnesses.

'Now I know, brothers, that neither you nor your leaders had any idea what you were really doing; this was the way God carried out what he had foretold, when he said through all his prophets that his Christ would suffer. Now you must repent and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out.'

Responsorial Psalm: Ps 4: 2, 4,7,9

R: Lord, let your face shine on us

When I call, answer me, O God of justice; from anguish you released me, have mercy and hear me! R

It is the Lord who grants favours to those whom he loves:

the Lord hears me whenever I call him. R

'What can bring us happiness?' many say. Lift up the light of your face on us, O Lord. R

Second Reading: 1 John 2:1-5

Jesus Christ is the sacrifice that takes away our sins and those of the whole world.

I am writing this, my children, to stop you sinning; but if anyone should sin, we have our advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ, who is just; he is the sacrifice that takes our sins away, and not only ours, but the whole world's. We can be sure that we know God only by keeping his commandments.

But when anyone does obey what he has said, God's love comes to perfection in him.

Gospel: Luke 24:35-48

It was written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead.

The disciples told their story of what had happened on the road and how they had recognised Jesus at the breaking of bread.

They were still talking about all this when Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you!' In a state of alarm and fright, they thought they were seeing a ghost. But he said, 'Why are you so agitated, and why are these doubts rising in your hearts? Look at my hands and feet; yes, it is I indeed. Touch me and see for yourselves; a ghost has no flesh and bones as you can see I have.' And as he said this he showed them his hands and feet. Their joy was so great that they still could not believe it, and they stood there dumbfounded; so he said to them, 'Have you anything here to eat?' And they offered him a piece of grilled fish, which he took and ate before their eyes.

Then he told them, 'This is what I meant when I said, while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses, in the Prophets and in the Psalms has to be fulfilled.' He then opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, 'So you see how it is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that, in his name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses to this.'
