#### "There is only one happiness in this life, to love and be loved-George Sand

After telling the parable of the vine and branches last Sunday, Jesus, in today's Gospel, teaches the disciples that they are to obey his commandment of love just as Jesus has obeyed his Heavenly Father's will by fulfilling His commandments and remaining inseparably bonded with his Father. Jesus' unconditional, forgiving, selfless, sacrificial love for us must be the criterion of our love for others.

When we hear the Word 'commandment' we are a bit uneasy. When someone commands us, our instinct is to rebel. When you ask your children to do something

... What reaction do you get – No, I won't. What Jesus is asking of us is not a slavish obedience to God. God is not interested in keeping us in line. He is not watching to see if we step out of line, he is not a policeman God. God wants what is the best for us, for our peace, happiness, and love. The essence of Christianity is love's self-forgetfulness (not dementia) and total dedication.

In a certain village in the Swiss Alps there is a small church which has been used by generations of worshippers. What makes it so beautiful is the story of how it came to be built on that particular spot.

Once there were two brothers working and living together on their farm. The older brother was married with a large family and the younger one was single. At the end of every day, the two brothers share the produce and profit and anything they get from the farm equally.

Then one day the younger brother said to himself, "It's not fair that we should share the produce and the profit equally. I'm alone and my needs are simple." So, each night he took a sack of grain from his bin and crept across the field between their houses, dumping it into his brother's bin.

Meanwhile, the married brother said to himself, "It's not fair that we should share the produce and the profit equally. After all, I'm married and I have my wife and my children to look after me in years to come. My brother has no one, and no one to take care of his future." So each night, he took a sack of grain and dumped it into his single brother's bin.

This continued for years and both of them were puzzled in light of the fact that their supply of grain never dwindled. Then at one very dark night the two brothers bumped into each other. Gradually it occurred to them what was going on. They dropped their sacks and hugged each other. Suddenly a voice from heaven said:' here I will build my church. For where people meet in love, there my presence shall be"

We practice our faith in Jesus with a gap of a long time to the apostles. We cannot have the same intensity of Jesus's experience of the Apostles. Still, we are called to follow and proclaim Jesus. That may be a challenge for us. But we can feel Jesus, his love – in the sacraments and in his Gospel and sometimes through his loving community.

We are his present followers; that means, as St. Peter we have the duty to uplift people, with our words, through our human and caring deeds. We can also reciprocate to the love of God and feel him as a friend and guide if we will. We can be the apostles of the Love of God as St John- of course in our manner. Let us seek this personal experience of God in this church, in this community and in our gatherings, in our family.

A story to ponder: "I was a neurotic for years. Anxious, depressed, selfish. And everyone kept telling me to change. And I resented them, and agreed with them, and wanted to change, but simply couldn't, no matter how I tried.



What hurt the most was that, like the others, my closest friend kept urging me to change. So, I felt powerless and trapped. One day he said, "Don't change. I love you as you are". Those words were music to my ears: Don't change, don't change, don't change... I love you as you are" I relaxed; I came alive. And, suddenly, I changed! Now I know that I couldn't really change till I found someone to love me whether I changed or not" (The Song of the Bird).

# This Sunday's Readings

#### **Entrance Antiphon:**

Proclaim a joyful sound and let it be heard; proclaim to the ends of the earth:
The Lord has freed his people. Alleluia.

First Reading: Acts 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48

The gift of the Holy Spirit was poured out upon the gentiles also.

As Peter reached the house Cornelius went out to meet him, knelt at his feet and prostrated himself. But Peter helped him up. 'Stand up,' he said 'I am only a man after all!'

Then Peter addressed them: 'The truth I have now come to realise' he said 'is that God does not have favourites, but that anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to him.'

While Peter was still speaking the Holy Spirit came down on all the listeners. Jewish believers who had accompanied Peter were all astonished that the gift of the Holy Spirit should be poured out on the pagans too, since they could hear them speaking strange languages and proclaiming the greatness of God. Peter himself then said, 'Could anyone refuse the water of baptism to these people, now they have received the Holy Spirit just as much as we have?' He then gave orders for them to be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ. Afterwards they begged him to stay on for some days.

I have told you this so that my own joy may be in you and your joy be complete. This is my commandment: love one another, as I have loved you. A man can have no greater love than to lay down his life for his friends. You are my friends, if you do what I command you. I shall not call you servants any more, because a servant does not know his master's business; I call you friends, because I have made known to you everything I have learnt from my Father. You did not choose me: no, I chose you; and I commissioned you to go out and to bear fruit, fruit that will last; and then the Father will give you anything you ask him in my name. What I command you is to love one another.'
