## "BE OPENED" - OPEN TO GOD, OPEN TO LIFE, OPEN TO LOVE!

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

How are you? The Most Holy Name of Mary feast takes place each year on September 12th, four days after the feast of the Birth of the Blessed Mother. This feast day has been celebrated since 1684 when Pope Innocent XI officially included it in the General Roman calendar, but actually dates back to 1513 as local celebrations were held in Spain. The feast day encourages us all to pray for her intercession to deepen our love of Christ and our relationship with the Lord. Mother Mary is the patroness of our parish and so, we will celebrate the feast on the coming Sunday at 10am Mass where in

the newly trained Junior altar servers will be commissioned and after the mass, we will have a fellowship. May I request you to bring a plate and enjoy the friendship of everyone in our community!

Healing has been a part and parcel of life all through the ages. Today's gospel presents a healing story. A man who was deaf and had a speech impediment was brought to him for healing. Jesus touched his ears and his tongue and uttered "Ephphatha" (Be opened), and immediately the man's ears were opened and his speech impediment was removed

(Mk 7:34-35). Jesus' action was a fulfilment of Isaiah's prophecy in the first



reading, "Then will the eyes of the blind be opened, the ears of the deaf be cleared; then will the lame leap like a stag, then the tongue of the dumb will sing," (Is. 35: 5-6). The church continues this healing activity of the Lord in many ways. The proclamation of the Good News is often at times accompanied by healing activities. Even in its early beginnings, proclamation and healing action often went together. Peter cured a cripple (Acts 3:6) Philip went preaching and healing (Acts 8:7) Even Saul who claimed his priority was to preach, effected cures (Acts 14:10) (Acts 28:8).

A young man got up to speak at the local university prayer gathering last week. At first, I thought he was speaking a language unknown to me; then gradually I realised he was speaking my language. But his ability to make himself understood was nearly strangled by an impediment that made him repeat himself in a loop, over and over, until he could complete a single sentence. I felt sad and frustrated for him.

When he finished speaking, an attractive young woman translated his message for him, emphasising his main points. And the group of people cheered his name, over and over. I realised that this young man, though impaired, was practically a cult figure among his peers. They knew him, liked him, and accepted him. Though his tongue was bound, his spirit was free.

Many of us labour under impediments to love that seem insurmountable. They may be physical, mental, or spiritual in nature, rooted in past injury or present dysfunction. However impossible it seems that we may be freed from what holds us bound, the appearance is deceiving. Jesus cured the deaf mute with his spirit. He holds the power to open hearts too.

There are times when some of us can be selectively deaf, hearing only what we want to hear. We can do this to our spouse, parents, children, and even to God. Jesus today addresses every one of us with the powerful word "Ephphatha" and heals us of our spiritual deafness and dumbness. He does not want any one of us to remain in the 'spiritual silent world.' "Being open to His words and ways means my being open to the attitudinal rearranging inside me and a changing of behaviours consequent to that rearranging". That is not the end of it all!

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# This Sunday's Readings

#### **Entrance Antiphon:**

You are just, O Lord, and your judgement is right; treat your servant in accord with your merciful love.

First reading: Isaiah 35:4-7

Then the ears of the deaf shall be opened and the tongues of the dumb speak.

Say to all faint hearts, 'Courage! Do not be afraid. Look, your God is coming, vengeance is coming, the retribution of God; he is coming to save you.'

Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, the ears of the deaf unsealed, then the lame shall leap like a deer and the tongues of the dumb sing for joy;

for water gushes in the desert, streams in the wasteland, the scorched earth becomes a lake, the parched land springs of water.

Responsorial Psalm: Ps 145: 7-10

#### R: Praise the Lord, my soul!

It is the Lord who keeps faith for ever, who is just to those who are oppressed. It is he who gives bread to the hungry, the Lord, who sets prisoners free. R

It is the Lord who gives sight to the blind, who raises up those who are bowed down, the Lord who loves the just, the Lord, who protects the stranger.

The Lord upholds the widow and orphan, but thwarts the path of the wicked.

The Lord will reighn for ever,

Zion's God, from age to age.

Second reading: James 2:1-5

Has not God chosen the poor of the world to inherit the kingdom?

My brothers, do not try to combine faith in Jesus Christ, our glorified Lord, with the making of distinctions between classes of people. Now suppose a man comes into your synagogue, beautifully dressed and with a gold



ring on, and at the same time a poor man comes in, in shabby clothes, and you take notice of the well-dressed man, and say, 'Come this way to the best seats'; then you tell the poor man, 'Stand over there' or 'You can sit on the

floor by my foot-rest.' Can't you see that you have used two different standards in your mind, and turned yourselves into judges, and corrupt judges at that?

Listen, my dear brothers: it was those who are poor according to the world that God chose, to be rich in faith and to be the heirs to the kingdom which he promised to those who love him.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia! Alleluia!

Jesus preached the Good News of the kingdom and healed all who were sick.

Alleluia!

**Gospel:** Mark 7:31-37

He makes the deaf hear and the dumb speak.

Returning from the district of Tyre, Jesus went by way of Sidon towards the Sea of Galilee, right through the Decapolis region. And they brought him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they asked him to lay his hand on him. He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, put his fingers into the man's ears and touched his tongue with spittle. Then looking up to heaven he sighed; and he said to him, 'Ephphatha', that is, 'Be opened.' And his ears were opened, and the ligament of his tongue was loosened and he spoke clearly. And Jesus ordered them to tell no one about it, but the more he insisted, the more widely they published it. Their admiration was unbounded. 'He has done all things well,' they said 'he makes the deaf hear and the dumb speak.'

#### **Communion Antiphon:**

Like the deer that years for running streams, so my soul is yearning for you, my God; my soul is thirsting for God, the living God.
