SOLEMNITY OF CHRIST THE KING

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Believe, you are all well under the mantle of Christ's love! Everything in our life is well directed by Jesus Christ who we glorify as our King this Sunday in a special way. On this august occasion, Rev. Peter Williams, Vicar General of the diocese of Parramatta, will be celebrating the 10am Mass and thereafter bless the lot for the construction of the admin office/priest's residence. We will have a special morning tea after the blessing. May I request you to join the celebration that the parish has been looking forward to for years! This is one of the God-given opportunities to come together and solidify our sense of belonging to one another. This is our project and we should be proud of achieving this with the grace and the guidance of God.

The feast of Christ the King was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925 to combat the growing secularism and atheism of his time; it is one of the so-called "idea feasts" that do not celebrate an event in the life of Jesus but rather some aspect of his identity. In it we recognise and honour Christ as ruler, a fantastic leader and universal shepherd. With today's celebration the liturgical year comes to a close and we begin the season of Advent from next Sunday.

"A beggar was going from door to door seeking alms and one day as he was going, he found the royal chariot coming towards him. He was now prepared to beg and get the maximum of alms. But the king performed a strange action. Instead of giving alms he asked the beggar to give him alms. The beggar was shocked and from his bag gave a little grain to the king. Then at dusk when he emptied his bag, he found the least little grain of gold. He wept bitterly and said, "I wish I had given the king all I had and would have become rich."- Tagore. The king wanted everything from the beggar so that the beggar could have everything in life. But the beggar missed the golden opportunity. On the cross the King Jesus gave everything including the last drop of blood and water that we may have life and that we live life to the full. He tells us that this kingdom is a moment of Joy and fulfillment.

The challenge of this feast is to recognise Christ our king in our daily routines, to recognise him in the poor, in the asylum seekers, refugees, victims of abuse, war and violence, less fortunate and underprivileged, in the elderly, in the neighbour who struggles with terminal illness, even the relative or neighbour who drives us crazy. Christ is at work not only in the actions of the ministers of the Church, but in the example the parents set for their children, the cordial relation to the neighbour, the respect for the rights of children, and in our efforts to share the blessings with the marginalised sector of society.

Christ's kingdom unfolds itself in bits and pieces when you and I choose right over wrong, self-giving over self-serving, hope over despair, caring over indifference, and integrity over duplicity. Christ's kingship is all about being credible and bearing witness to the ultimate Truth. Christ's kingdom is a reality in our midst today and every day.

The challenge of God's kingdom is:

To let God be God in us;

To let God be God in our church;

To let God be God in our neighbourhood;

To let God be God in our job, in our family, and in our world. (Sources duly acknowledged)

Look around and see the Kingdom of God in our midst of many selfless people who sacrifice their lives for the safety and wellbeing of everyone in our country. We could give expression to the kingdom of Christ in our active, and other-involved oriented faith life.
