On this fourth Sunday of advent, we reflect on Mary visiting her cousin Elizabeth in her pregnant state (the second mystery of the Joyful mysteries of the Rosary). Recently, we visited that Biblical "hill country" called Ein Karem, the village of Zachariah and Elizabeth. Ein Karem is 90 kilometres away from Nazareth and by foot it took a week to travel. I could see how difficult the journey would have been for the pregnant Mary at a time when the road was rough, and no easy transportation was viable. Mary embodies the core of Christianity here at its best- caring, committed to the well-being of others. The visitation was a journey of service, a visit to her cousin who needed help. Mary rightly understood the longing of Elizabeth at that point in time of her life.

We are just two days away from the celebration of the birth of Jesus. Though it is a time of joy and celebration, this can be a time of loneliness, or intense sorrow for some people. As we get ready to celebrate this historical event of God becoming a Man, we also welcome and reach out to neighbourhoods, especially those who are suffering the most during these days. I presume that you are able to reach out at least once in this time and share God-given blessings. The visitation of our Mother Mary is a gentle reminder that we should keep the spirit of caring, sharing and persevering until the end of time.

"Mary and Elizabeth had something else to share – their faith. The prayers they said have been said ever since. The stage was small, but the audience has been millions ever since. They were not shy about their faith in their God. In times like ours, we need to externalize our faith in concrete actions both religious and corporal. We need to find God again, and let ourselves be open to him in the deepest areas of life, just like the husbands of these women, Joseph, and Zechariah, as well as their wives, were open to God" (Donal Neary S.J.)

The anti-toxin injections had been too late. As he now sat with his wife by the boy's bedside awaiting the child's death the doorbell rang. The doctor shouted to his secretary, "I don't want to see anyone." But the visitor would not go away. It was the farmer Rivaz who had walked 10 kilometres from Roseland. His son was sick. "I'll come tomorrow" the doctor told him. "But if you don't come now, he won't make it through the night," the farmer insisted. They began a discussion. "You can cure my son." "But mine's lost, he's beyond all cure." "But mine isn't." "Well, I'll come tomorrow morning." "Then it will be too late." "Let me close the eyes of my dying child." "But if you cannot help him any longer." "As long as my son is alive, I'll remain with him." "All right, then both the children will die." The doctor then asked for the symptoms of the boy's sickness, and they were the same as his son's had been. But it was still not too late to save him. So, the doctor decided to go with the farmer. This Sunday's Readings



Entrance Antiphon:

Drop down dew from above, you heavens, and let the clouds rain down the Just One; let the earth be opened and bring forth a Saviour.

First reading: Micah 5:1-4

Out of you will be born the one who is to rule over Israel.

The Lord says this:

You, Bethlehem Ephrathah, the least of the clans of Judah, out of you will be born for me the one who is to rule over Israel; his origin goes back to the distant past, to the days of old.

The Lord is therefore going to abandon them till the time when she who is to give birth gives birth. Then the remnant of his brothers will come back to the sons of Israel.

He will stand and feed his flock with the power of the Lord, with the majesty of the name of his God. They will live secure, for from then on he will extend his power to the ends of the land. He himself will be peace.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 79:2-3, 15-16, 18-19

R: Lord, make us turn to you; let us see your face and we shall be saved.

O sheperd of Isreal, hear us, shine forth from your cherubim throne. O Lord, rouse up your might, O Lord, come to our help. R

Visit this vine and protect it, the vine your right hand has planted.

May your hand be on the man you have chosen, the man you have given your strength.

And we shall never forsake you again:
give us life that we may call upon your name.

Second reading: Hebrews 10:5-10

I am coming to do your will.

This is what Christ said, on coming into the world:

You who wanted no sacrifice or oblation, prepared a body for me.

You took no pleasure in holocausts or sacrifices for sin;

then I said,

just as I was commanded in the scroll of the book, 'God, here I am! I am coming to obey your will.'

Notice that he says first: You did not want what the Law lays down as the things to be offered, that is: the sacrifices, the oblations, the holocausts and the sacrifices for sin, and you took no pleasure in them; and then he says: Here I am! I am coming to obey your will. He is abolishing the first sort to replace it with the second. And this will was for us to be made holy by the offering of his body made once and for all by Jesus Christ.

Why should it happen that I am honoured with a visit from the mother of my Lord?

Mary set out and went as quickly as she could to a town in the hill country of Judah. She went into Zechariah's house and greeted Elizabeth. Now as soon as Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leapt in her womb and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. She gave a loud cry and said, 'Of all women you are the most blessed, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. Why should I be honoured with a visit from the mother of my Lord? For the moment your greeting reached my ears, the child in my womb leapt for joy. Yes, blessed is she who believed that the promise made her by the Lord would be fulfilled.'


