"THE MOST PATHETIC PERSON IN THE WORLD IS SOMEONE WHO HAS SIGHT BUT NO VISION" - HELEN KELLER

Makeover shows are very popular on TV. Many are hooked up watching The Block and other similar shows on TV. The theme is always the same: an ugly, broken-down house is transformed into a beautiful dwelling. These shows are exotic and commercial so as to fan the desire of the people for cosy houses. Baruch called for some sort of makeover for Jerusalem. He wanted the people who were living in exile, and agony, to think in a new way and to have a new vision even in the midst of utter darkness. The religious vision prophesied by Baruch did create a sense of hope in the oppressed people and they were able to realise God's fidelity in loving them and caring for them (First Reading).

In our own time, we need such vision. Pope Francis has provided many with just such hope, and most people have responded eagerly and joyfully — even those who do not share his religious faith. It is a mystery why some find his hopeful vision of love and mercy so frightening and threatening. In our own words, thoughts and deeds, it is important to live out this vision of hope for the sake of the world. The world is still often a dark and scary place, perhaps now more than ever. Many people still yearn for peace, freedom and prosperity. The God response is still the same: put aside the ways of fear, violence, greed, hatred and selfishness. Even in the midst of darkness, uncertainty, fear and chaos, God is very present, and God always has the last word.

Far too many of us live in a schizophrenic value world. Far too many of us believe that our society is in bad shape while at the same time asserting that our personal lives are in good shape. Far too many are quick to point out that others need conversion and repentance and yet they themselves need not confess their sins and repent. We will not be able to sustain such a schizophrenic and sick culture very much longer. Living with such split vision is not living at all. That's why, John the Baptist invites us to fix our lives in order with a clear vision of experiencing the true freedom and joy emanating from a sincere repentance/reconstruction of our lives. Are we willing to acquire that vision? It is a matter of choice and never a matter of feeling like it. It is not up to God; it is up to us. (Excerpted from Fr. Scott Lewis and Fr. This Sunday's Readings

HOLL

Entrance Antiphon:

O people of Sion, behold, the Lord will come to save the nations, and the Lord will make the glory of his voice heard in the joy of your heart.

First reading: Baruch, 5:1-9

Jerusalem - God will show you splendour.

Jerusalem, take off your dress of sorrow and distress, put on the beauty of the glory of God for ever, wrap the cloak of the integrity of God around you, put the diadem of the glory of the Eternal on your head: since God means to show your splendour to every nation under heaven, since the name God gives you for ever will be, 'Peace through integrity, and honour through devotedness.' Arise, Jerusalem, stand on the heights and turn your eyes to the east: see your sons reassembled from west and east at the command of the Holy One, jubilant that God has remembered them. For God has decreed the flattening of each high mountain, of the everlasting hills, the filling of the valleys to make the ground level so that Israel can walk in safety under the glory of God. And the forests and every fragrant tree will provide shade for Israel at the command of God; for God will guide Israel in joy by the light of his glory
