"JOY DOES NOT SIMPLY HAPPEN TO US. WE HAVE TO CHOOSE JOY AND KEEP CHOOSING IT EVERY DAY" — HENRI NOUWEN

There is a story told of two buckets which were kept at a well. Of the two, one was always sad and gloomy, while the other was always happy and joyful. The happy one said to the sad one - "What's the matter with you? I see that you are always unhappy, sad, and gloomy!" The sad one said - "Oh! It is my life. When I think of it, I feel very bad and become so sad." "What do you think of your life?" asked the first. The second replied - "Oh! When I look at my life – it is ever empty. See, however many times I come out of the well full, I always go to it empty, and this emptiness makes me very sad and gloomy." "Oh!" said the first, "but I do not look at my life that way." "How do you look at your life then?" inquired the second. The first replied - "Oh! I find my life always full. See, however many times I go into the well empty, I always come out full, and this fullness fills me with happiness & joy."

We notice that the life of both the buckets is essentially the same, but their looking at it is different. And this makes one ever sad & mad, while the other is always happy & full of joy. This Third Sunday of Advent is also called "Gaudete" Sunday or "Rejoice" Sunday. "Gaudete" is Latin for "Rejoice!" Joy is the essence of all the three readings of this Sunday. St Paul invites every one of us to "rejoice in the Lord always." When everything goes well, there is all the reason for one to be happy and joyful but when there is a deep-seated sadness over an unfixable situation, joy feels elusive. Yet, St. Paul writes in Philippians 4:4 to rejoice always. He is writing these words in prison, and to further the matter, he later speaks of himself in the second letter to the Corinthians as being 'sorrowful yet rejoicing.' Certainly, he knows something that we apparently don't. Many of us are weighed down by grim struggles such as financial constraints, illness, or loss of a beloved one or behavioral problems of the children etc. How is it possible to have joy in these scenarios? The readings today take us through a pathway that enables us to move forward with peace and joy. Pam Kanaly Co-founder, Arise Ministries shares a few thoughts on the second reading of today whose thoughts I would like to paraphrase here below.

Our joy is not based on mere emotions. For example, losing a few kilos of weight or being relieved of a long-term worry. Our joy should not be determined by outside stimuli or by the happenings around us. It does not depend on how comfortable you are, what house you live in, what car you drive, what kind of food and drink you eat and so on. Perhaps you lost your job, your health has taken a downturn, or your former husband did not pay child support. "If only circumstances were different," we say. "Then I'd find joy." Again, this isn't true joy. Instead, it's a kind of joy based on secular realities that are unpredictable, leaving one constantly vulnerable to outside elements."

The joy that Paul is talking about is one of spiritual. It has nothing to do with our emotions or circumstances. It is not a joy based on temporal and material things. It is a joy based solely on the Lord. It is a reality that surpasses our understanding. It's a peace that abides in the heart that knows no matter what, all is well because Jesus is in the midst of its outcome. It's not driven or tossed by worldly issues but remains a constant inside stabilizer above emotions or circumstances (Source duly acknowledged)

The question is how we cultivate spiritual joy. It is in founding our life on Jesus, His teachings and 'our love in action' for those who find themselves in the human desert all around us. So, we get to pick joy that would govern our day today life: Emotional joy? Circumstantial joy? Or spiritual joy?

This Sunday's Readings



Entrance Antiphon:

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near.

First reading: Zephaniah, 3:14-18

With gladness the Lord will rejoice over you.

Shout for joy, daughter of Zion, Israel, shout aloud! Rejoice, exult with all your heart, daughter of Jerusalem! The Lord has repealed your sentence; he has driven your enemies away. The Lord, the king of Israel, is in your midst; you have no more evil to fear. When that day comes, word will come to Jerusalem: Zion, have no fear, do not let your hands fall limp. The Lord your God is in your midst, a victorious warrior. He will exult with joy over you, he will renew you by his love; he will dance with shouts of joy for you as on a day of festival.

Responsorial Psalm: Isaiah 12:2-6

R: Cry out with joy and gladness: for among you is the great and Holy One of Israel.

Truly, God is my salvation,
I trust, I shall not fear.
For the Lord is my strength, my song,
he became my saviour.
With joy you will draw water
from the wells of salvation.

Give thanks to the Lord, give praise to his name!

Make his mighty deeds known to the peoples!

Declare the greatness of his name.

Sing a psalm to the Lord
For he has done glorious deeds,
make them known to all the earth!
People of Zion, sing and shout for joy
for great in your midst is the Holy One of Israel.

Second reading: Philippians 4:4-7

The Lord is near.

I want you to be happy, always happy in the Lord; I repeat, what I want is your happiness. Let your tolerance be evident to everyone: the Lord is very near.

There is no need to worry;

but if there is anything you need, pray for it, asking God for it with prayer and thanksgiving, and that peace of God, which is so much greater than we can understand, will guard your hearts and your thoughts, in Christ Jesus.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia!

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me; he sent me to bring Good News to the poor.

Gospel: Luke 3:10-18 What, then, must we do?

When all the people asked John, 'What must we do?' he answered, 'If anyone has two tunics he must share with the man who has none, and the one with something to eat must do the same.'

There were tax collectors too who came for baptism, and these said to him, 'Master, what must we do?' He said to them, 'Exact no more than your rate.' Some soldiers asked him in their turn, 'What about us? What must we do?' He said to them, 'No intimidation! No extortion! Be content with your pay!'

A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people, who were beginning to think that John might be the Christ, so John declared before them all, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fan is in his hand to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.' As well as this, there were many other things he said to exhort the people and to announce the Good News to them.
