"GOD'S GIFTS ALIVE IN CONCERN FOR OTHERS"

Today's Gospel, the first miracle of Jesus, is with many threads - the insight into the relationship between Mary and Jesus - the miracle itself - the fact that the miraculous wine is better than the original - the fact of Jesus honouring the young couple in this way - an indirect reference to the sanctity of marriage, and the truth that family is the basic unit of society and so on. Let me try to underscore two significant messages for our faith life. Honor and shame are two most basic elements in Mediterranean culture; they were the primary concern for everybody. A man's social status as a person with honour is closely linked to this ability to maintain or improve the economic position in the family. The preoccupation of men with honour is a strong element in the culture of the area.

This cultural background explains the dynamics of today's gospel story. The bridegroom's honour is at stake. Failure to provide enough wine for the guests would have ruined his reputation in the rural hamlet of Cana. Upon the notice given by Mother Mary, Jesus discretely acted to save the honour of his host. As we read in the letter to the Hebrews, Jesus is our strength when we are weak; He is our direction when we are lost; He is our Peace when we find ourselves in chaos and confusion; He is our stronghold in our limitations etc. It all needs a personal experience of Jesus in our life.

Secondly, the relationship between Mary and Jesus: How come Mary knew that Jesus could do the miracle? Good mothers know their children. They know the hidden talents and potentialities of their children. There are many young men and women who have gone on to accomplish great things in life because their mothers believed in them and encouraged them.

One striking factor in both of them is to prioritize the needs of others. Mother Mary never asked Jesus to use his divine power to multiply the bread, turn the water on the dining table into wine, or double the money to make ends meet. In the case of Jesus, He knew he had this power to perform miracles. After his forty day fast in the desert he was hungry and the devil suggested to him to turn some stones into bread and eat, but he did not do it. Yet, he went out and multiplied bread for crowds of his followers.

What do we understand from their actions? God's gifts to individuals are not meant primarily for one's own benefit but for the wellbeing of others. The gifts of praying, singing, teaching, caring, sharing, encouraging, supporting, motivating, writing etc, if we use them for the common good, we will begin to see miracles. Concern for others is the beginning of miracles. (Source duly acknowledged)

1 Peter 4:10 says "Each one should use whatever gift he has received to serve others, faithfully administering God's grace in its various forms." Each one of us should use whatever gift we have received to serve others. We must put your gifts to work. Building the church is a collective, collaborative effort. Our unique gifts, skills and talents are not just for our own benefit but for the sake of all God's people (and that's everybody)!

What are your gifts? What are your skills? How can you use them to pitch in, and help build our Holy Name of Mary community?

How can you invest them even further and be an instrument that with others can help heal the world and the planet?

Second reading: 1 Corinthians 12:4-11

One and the same Spirit distributes different gifts as he chooses.

There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose. One may have the gift of preaching with wisdom given him by the Spirit; another may have the gift of preaching instruction given him by the same Spirit; and another the gift of faith given by the same Spirit; another again the gift of healing, through this one Spirit; one, the power of miracles; another, prophecy; another the gift of recognising spirits; another the gift of tongues and another the ability to interpret them. All these are the work of one and the same Spirit, who distributes different gifts to different people just as he chooses.

Gospel: John 2:1-11

The first of the signs given by Jesus was at Cana in Galilee.

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee. The mother of Jesus was there, and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited. When they ran out of wine, since the wine provided for the wedding was all finished, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' Jesus said 'Woman, why turn to me? My hour has not come yet.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.' There were six stone water jars standing there, meant for the ablutions that are customary among the Jews: each could hold twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to the servants, 'Fill the jars with water', and they filled them to the brim. 'Draw some out now' he told them 'and take it to the steward.' They did this; the steward tasted the water, and it had turned into wine.

Having no idea where it came from – only the servants who had drawn the water knew – the steward called the bridegroom and said, 'People generally serve the best wine first, and keep the cheaper sort till the guests have had plenty to drink; but you have kept the best wine till now.'

This was the first of the signs given by Jesus: it was given at Cana in Galilee. He let his glory be seen, and his disciples believed in him.
