When John was a child, his mom liked to make breakfast, food for dinner, every now and then. One evening, after a long, hard day at work, she placed a plate of eggs, sausage, and extremely burned toast in front of his dad. John was waiting to see if anyone noticed! Yet all his dad did was to reach for his toast, smile at my mom, and ask his son how his day was at school. John, without telling anything to him, was watching his dad smear butter and jelly on that toast and ate every bite. When they got up from the table that evening, his mom apologized to his dad for burning the toast. In reply, the husband told her "Baby, I love burnt toast". Later that night, John went to kiss Daddy goodnight, and he asked him if he really liked his burnt toast. He wrapped him in his arms and said, "Son, your Momma put in a hard day at work today and she's really tired. And besides, a little burnt toast never hurt anyone!"

Life is full of imperfect things...and imperfect people. What is important is to accept each other's faults and choose to celebrate each other's differences. For everyone is special, unique and invaluable in the sight of God. No one is left out from His loving embrace!

In the first reading Isaiah feels that he is a man of unclean lips; in the second reading, St Paul incriminates himself as the persecutor and his self-esteem is down to Zero; I am the least of the apostles and I am unfit for the apostolate. In the Gospel, Peter estimates himself as a sinful man unworthy to stand near to Jesus. All three of these men look at themselves in relationship to the Creator or the Christ and recognize their own sinfulness and lowliness in the face of a being that is so awesome to them.

All three of these men who were humbled and felt sinful in the face of their God, are cleansed by God, and called to do God's work. Each Sunday, we go through the same process ourselves at Mass. Before receiving the body of Christ, we all pray, "Lord, I am not worthy that you should come under my roof but only say the word and my soul shall be healed". Just like Isaiah, Peter and Paul, we recognize our unworthiness in the face of God but show faith that God can heal us and make us better. And like Isaiah, Peter and Paul, we too are called to go out into the world and be ambassadors of Christ, living out the good News and making some sort of difference in the world.

Each morning grandpa rose early and went to the church for Mass, and he used to take his grandson along with him. His grandson was keen to copy him and tried to imitate him in every way he could. One day the grandson asked: Grandpa, I try to go with you to the church for Mass and I don't understand the readings, some other rituals and what I understand and get, I forget as soon as I come back home.

The Grandfather quietly replied: Take this empty coal basket down to the stream and bring me back a basket of water. The loving boy did as he was told, but all the water leaked out before he returned to the cottage. The grandfather laughed, sending him back to the river and said: You'll have to move a little faster next time. This time the boy ran quicker, but again the basket was empty before he reached home. Out of breath, he told his grandfather that it was impossible to carry water in a basket, and off he went to fetch a bucket. This doting grandpa replied: I don't want a bucket of water; I want a basket of water. You're just not trying hard enough. He then stepped through the front door to watch the boy try again. At this point, the boy knew the task's impossibility, but he wanted to show his grandfather that even if he ran as fast as he could, the water would leak out before he arrived back. The boy again dipped the basket into the stream and ran hard, but when he reached his grandfather, the basket was yet again empty. Breathlessly the boy reminded: See Grandpa, it's useless! Grandpa then advised: So, you think it is useless? Look again into the basket. The boy looked at the basket and for the first time realized it was now very different. The basket had been transformed from a dirty old coal receptacle into a clean fresh basket, inside and out - ready for all types of new tasks it could not have done as a coal basket. Son, that's what happens when you go to Mass. You might not understand or remember everything, but when you participate and listen to the Scriptures etc you will be changed, inside and out. That is the work of Jesus' word in our hearts and lives. (Soul Supply)

We need to learn to take the good, the bad, and the ugly parts of our life and lay them at the feet of GOD. Because in the end, He's the only One who will be able to give us a relationship where burnt toast isn't a deal-breaker! God gives a toast in every Mass and welcomes the sinners and makes them feel better and healthy in all relationships.

This Sunday's Readings

Entrance Antiphon:

O come, let us worship God and bow low before the God who made us, for he is the Lord our God.

First reading: Isaiah 6:1-8

Here am I! send me.

In the year of King Uzziah's death I saw the Lord seated on a high throne; his train filled the sanctuary; above him stood seraphs, each one with six wings.

And they cried out to one another in this way,

'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts. His glory fills the whole earth.'

The foundations of the threshold shook with the voice of the one who cried out, and the Temple was filled with smoke. I said:

'What a wretched state I am in! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have looked at the King, the Lord of Hosts.'

Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding in his hand a live coal which he had taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. With this he touched my mouth and said:

'See now, this has touched your lips, your sin is taken away, your iniquity is purged.'

Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying:

'Whom shall I send? Who will be our messenger?' I answered, 'Here I am, send me.'

you increased the strength of my soul.


All earth's kings shall thank you when they hear the words of your mouth. They shall sing of the Lord's ways: 'How great is the glory of the Lord!' R

Second reading: 1 Corinthians 15:1-11

I preach what they preach, and this is what you believe.

Brothers, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, the gospel that you received and in which you are firmly established; because the gospel will save you only if you keep believing exactly what I preached to you – believing anything else will not lead to anything.



Well then, in the first place, I taught you what I had been taught myself, namely that Christ died for our sins, in accordance with the scriptures; that he was buried; and that he was raised to life on the third day, in accordance with the scriptures; that he appeared first to Cephas and secondly to the Twelve. Next he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers at the same time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died; then he appeared to James, and then to all the apostles; and last of all he appeared to me too; it was as though I was born when no one expected it.

I am the least of the apostles; in fact, since I persecuted the Church of God, I hardly deserve the name apostle; but by God's grace that is what I am, and the grace that he gave me has not been fruitless. On the contrary, I, or rather the grace of God that is with me, have worked harder than any of the others; but what matters is that I preach what they preach, and this is what you all believed.

Gospel Acclamation:

Come follow me, says the Lord, and I will make you fishers of my people.

Gospel: Luke 5:1-11

They left everything and followed him.

Jesus was standing one day by the Lake of Gennesaret, with the crowd pressing round him listening to the word of God, when he caught sight of two boats close to the bank. The fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats – it was Simon's – and asked him to put out a little from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat.

When he had finished speaking he said to Simon, 'Put out into deep water and pay out your nets for a catch.' 'Master,' Simon replied, 'we worked hard all night long and caught nothing, but if you say so, I will pay out the nets.' And when they had done this they netted such a huge number of fish that their nets began to tear, so they signalled to their companions in the other boat to come and help them; when these came, they filled the two boats to sinking point.

When Simon Peter saw this he fell at the knees of Jesus saying, 'Leave me, Lord; I am a sinful man.' For he and all his companions were completely overcome by the catch they had made; so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were Simon's partners. But Jesus said to Simon, 'Do not be afraid; from now on it is men you will catch.' Then, bringing their boats back to land, they left everything and followed him.

Communion Antiphon:

Let them thank the Lord for his mercy, his wonders for the children of men, for he satisfies the thirsty soul, and the hungry he fills with good things.
