FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Sunday, 11 May 2025

"LISTEN FOR GOD'S VOICE IN EVERYTHING YOU DO AND EVERYWHERE YOU GO; HE IS THE ONE THAT WILL KEEP YOU ON TRACK."

- PROVERBS 3: 6

Today is the 4th Sunday of Easter and it is commonly known as "Good Shepherd Sunday," a day in which the Church recalls the relationship between God and His people as described in the image of Shepherd and Sheep. Each year, the Gospel Reading of today is chosen from Chapter 10 of St. John's Gospel, where Jesus speaks of himself as the "Good Shepherd." In recent times, this day has also become known as "Vocations Sunday," a day when our Church prays especially for new shepherds and pastors to lead the Christian communities.

The image of a shepherd brings home a few strong messages: As described in the Old Testament, a shepherd spends his whole life with his sheep, taking care of them, raising them, loving them, healing them and most of all, protecting them from all harm. These are the qualities of an original shepherd. As Jesus claims that He is the good shepherd, we can instantly identify the above qualities in Him and there is no doubt that He is the Good Shepherd par excellence. I would like to focus today on the responsibility of the 'sheep' in reply to what the good shepherd does to them. What stands out is 'listening to the voice of the good shepherd and not to the voice of the fake ones. The sheep are easily taught and conditioned to listen only to their master. They learn the voice of their shepherd as it was a common practice for shepherds to regularly speak to their sheep as most of us do to our pets today. Once the sheep became used to the shepherd's voice, they would turn and follow him whenever he called and wherever he led them. So, it is with us. If we are familiar with the voice of God speaking to us in various ways, we would be able to follow Him even unknowingly.

Two old acquaintances, who had not seen each other for years, were walking down the street together, renewing old times.

"Just a minute," said one, "I think I hear something," and turning a loose paving stone over he liberated a cricket which was chirping merrily away.

"Why, that's astounding. Of all the people on the street at this hour, hurrying from work, you alone hear the cricket above all the traffic noises."

"My friend," said the first. "I learned a long time ago that people hear in life only what they want to hear. Now, the noise of traffic has neither increased nor decreased in the past few moments, but watch." And as he finished speaking, he let a silver half dollar fall from his pocket to the sidewalk. Everyone within an amazingly large hearing distance stopped and looked around"- Anonymous

This begs the question, "what are we most familiar with?" As we spend time with God in praying and reading the Scriptures and learning His language, tone of voice every day, we will be able to hear and listen to His voice even in the midst of the hums and drums of our lives. We can be busy with our daily chores, and still recognize His voice talking to us and we will be able to follow. The truth is that He speaks to us not only at prayer and worship, but also through our family members, friends, colleagues, office mates, co-workers, strangers, nature, and even in simple but powerful ways.

There are so many voices 'wooing' our attention today; some are good and some are not so good. We are pressured by the voice of the media, consumeristic and techno culture, love of money, a desire for recognition and so much more. There are powerful influences and whether we want to believe it or not, they do affect us to the extent of silencing the voice of God. In the challenges, opportunities, and decisions of our life and our work we need God's guidance and to sense his loving presence with us. Let the voice of the Good Shepherd grab our attention so that we can follow.

This Sunday's Readings



Entrance Antiphon:

The merciful love of the Lord fills the earth; by the word of the Lord the heavens were made, alleluia.

First reading: Acts 13:14, 43-52 We are now turning to the gentiles.

Paul and Barnabas carried on from Perga till they reached Antioch in Pisidia. Here they went to the synagogue on the sabbath and took their seats.

When the meeting broke up, many Jews and devout converts joined Paul and Barnabas, and in their talks with them Paul and Barnabas urged them to remain faithful to the grace God had given them.

The next sabbath almost the whole town assembled to hear the word of God. When they saw the crowds, the Jews, prompted by jealousy, used blasphemies and contradicted everything Paul said. Then Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly. 'We had to proclaim the word of God to you first, but since you have rejected it, since you do not think yourselves worthy of eternal life, we must turn to the pagans. For this is what the Lord commanded us to do when he said:

I have made you a light for the nations, so that my salvation may reach the ends of the earth'

It made the pagans very happy to hear this and they thanked the Lord for his message; all who were destined for eternal life became believers. Thus the word of the Lord spread through the whole countryside.

But the Jews worked upon some of the devout women of the upper classes and the leading men of the city and persuaded them to turn against Paul and Barnabas and expel them from their territory. So they shook the dust from their feet in defiance and went off to Iconium; but the disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit.

Responsorial Psalm: 99:1-3, 5

R: We are his people, the sheep of his flock.

Cry out with joy to the Lord, all the earth. Serve the Lord with gladness.
Come before him, singing for joy.

Know that he, the Lord, is God. He made us, we belong to him, we are his people, the sheep of his flock.

Indeed, how good is the Lord, eternal his merciful love.
He is faithful from age to age. R

Second reading: Apocalypse 7:9, 14-17

The Lamb who is at the throne will be their shepherd and will lead them to springs of living water.

I, John, saw a huge number, impossible to count, of people from every nation, race, tribe and language; they were standing in front of the throne and in front of the Lamb, dressed in white robes and holding palms in their hands. One of the elders said to me, 'These are the people who have been through the great persecution, and because they have washed their robes white again in the blood of the Lamb, they now stand in front of God's throne and serve him day and night in his sanctuary; and the One who sits on the throne will spread his tent over them. They will never hunger or thirst again; neither the sun nor scorching wind will ever plague them, because the Lamb who is at the throne will be their shepherd and will lead them to springs of living water; and God will wipe away all tears from their eyes.'

Gospel Acclamation:


