### HOPE DOES NOT DISAPPOINT, NO MATTER HOW BAD THINGS GET.

St Augustine was walking by the seashore one day contemplating and trying to understand the mystery of the Holy Trinity when he saw a small boy running back and forth from the water to a spot on the seashore. The boy was using a seashell to carry the water from the ocean and place it into a small hole in the sand. The Bishop of Hippo approached him and asked, "My boy, what are you doing?" "I am trying to bring all the sea into this hole," the boy replied with a sweet smile. "But that is impossible, my dear child, the hole cannot contain all that water," said Augustine. The boy paused in his work, stood up, looked into the eyes of the Saint, and replied, "It is no more impossible than what you are trying to do – comprehend the immensity of the mystery of the Holy Trinity with your small intelligence." The Saint was absorbed by such a keen response from that child and turned his eyes from him for a short while. When he glanced down to ask him something else, the boy had vanished.

Happy Feast of the Holy Trinity! We have just completed the cycle of the Easter mysteries. Now the Church invites us to celebrate three solemn feasts – the Trinity, Corpus Christi, and the Sacred Heart of Jesus. In these feasts we celebrate some aspect of our faith. It is a celebration, therefore, not an academic exercise. On Trinity Sunday, we celebrate our participation in the life of the loving community of Father, Son, and Spirit. Jesus tells the disciples that the Spirit of Truth will guide them to all the Truth.

The spirit of truth guides us to all truth: the truth about the grace in which we stand, the truth about our sharing in the Triune God's life of love. Our participation in the Triune God's life is not only an experience of peace with God through Christ. It is also an experience of boasting about our afflictions.

Sharing in the life of the Triune God's loving community, we boast of our sufferings. Why? Because the Spirit of truth guides us to the truth that our suffering produces perseverance, and that our perseverance produces a tried and tested character, a character of firm commitment to the beloved community, a society where all people are treated with dignity and respect, where there is social equity and justice for everyone (Second reading). Because we can be people of tried and tested character, we can be people of hope. We can courageously, hopefully love God and our neighbour without pessimism, fatalism, or resignation, no matter how bad things get.

On Trinity Sunday during this Jubilee of Hope, we confess that hope does not disappoint. That is what Pope Francis said in his proclamation of the Jubilee of Hope: "hope does not disappoint."

Our hope will not disillusion us or fail us. Our hope will be fulfilled. Sharing in the Triune God's life of love, we believe that our hope will be fulfilled. We expect that.

At the end of the Selma to Montgomery March in 1965, Dr. King was sure that hope does not disappoint. In 1965, just as today, people asked how long it will take for real change to come, how long will it take for our hope to be fulfilled. Dr. King confessed that hope does not disappoint.

People are asking today, "How long will it take?" in the context of family relationships, enduring hardships of various nature, disappointments and frustrations, stress, depression, sickness, and loss etc. How long will it take for the present condition to turn around to be good? However difficult the moment, however frustrating the hour, it will not be long...hope does not disappoint." (excerpts from the reflections of Fr. Lance Nadeau MM)

As St Paul says, "God's love poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given us' strengthens us to face suffering with hope and joy. Besides, we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses—women and men of affliction, endurance, proven character, and hope that does not disappoint—let us throw off everything that hinders and run with perseverance the race that bends toward love and justice. Let us pray to see how we might be a delight to others, sharing God's love with everyone we encounter even in the smallest of ways. Let us always remember, Hope does not disappoint!

But that is not all we can boast about; we can boast about our sufferings. These sufferings bring patience, as we know, and patience brings perseverance, and perseverance brings hope, and this hope is not deceptive, because the love of God has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit which has been given us.

Gospel: John 16:12-15

Whatever the Father has is mine. The Spirit will receive what I give and tell you about it.

'I still have many things to say to you but they would be too much for you now. But when the Spirit of truth comes he will lead you to the complete truth, since he will not be speaking as from himself but will say only what he has learnt; and he will tell you of the things to come. He will glorify me since all he tells you will be taken from what is mine. Everything the Father has is mine; that is why I said: All he tells you will be taken from what is mine.'

#### **Communion Antiphon:**

Since you are children of God, God has sent into your hearts the Spirit of his Son, the Spirit who cries out: Abba, Father.
