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THE EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS

Sunday, 14 September 2025

GOD ALWAYS GIVES STRENGTH; ENOUGH TO BEAR OUR SUFFERING

This Sunday, we are celebrating the solemn feast of the Exaltation of the Cross which recalls a historic event that proved to be extremely important in the life of the Christian church, and to underline the importance of the symbol and reality of the cross in the daily life of every Christian man or woman. We are also celebrating the feast of the Holy Name of Mary; our parish and school feast this Sunday. The invocation of the name of Mary is a powerful prayer. Hail Mary not just a name, but a supreme gift of grace to all of us, a gift of a mother who loves unconditionally, who always loves, who loves each and every one of her children given to her by God. Mother Mary is the patroness of our parish and we thank her for all her intercession for the good of our community, young and old and we pray that our parish continues to walk with Mother Mary in bearing witness to Jesus and His Kingdom. May I greet everyone of our parish, a Very Happy Feast. Come on, let us build our parish in the light of the Gospel.

Elie Wiesel was a survivor of the dreaded Nazi concentration camp Auschwitz. He wrote of his experiences in the book The Night. In that book he relates the harrowing story of two Jewish men and a Jewish boy hanged alongside one another. Having climbed the stairs the two adults cried, "Long live liberty," but the boy was silent. Behind Wiesel someone desperately asked, "Where is God, where is He?" The chairs the victims were standing on were kicked out from under them and the three hung there. The adults died quickly, but the boy's weight wasn't great enough to snap his neck immediately. For more than half an hour he hung there, dying in slow agony before their eyes. Again, Wiesel heard the question "Where is God now?" And standing there Wiesel heard a voice within himself answer, "Where is he? Here he is. He is hanging here on these gallows."

When Wiesel said it was God hanging on the gallows he indicated the death of his faith. Faith in God died with that hanging child. But there is another interpretation, that God suffers with those who suffer, seen most visibly in the death of Christ hanging on his own gallows, the cross. (Source: Elie Wiesel, The Night (1969). In a world that cries with signs of destruction and defeat, we are challenged to see the great reversal that is offered in the cross. He knows in great detail the devastation caused by tragedy. He understands the pain and sorrow acquainted with grief and loss. We are not alone in our suffering; He is there for us. He is in control of our life no matter how bad things may happen. We are never out of His reach.

As someone said, "We are a religion of the cross and of all that it stood for. We do not run away from suffering and death, but rather we transform them into salvation and resurrection. We do not run away from humiliation, but rather we joyfully accept humiliation for the sake of the glory of God. We do not run away from the lowest of human beings, but rather we embrace them as other Christs."

Food for thought:

This Sunday's Readings

HOLY

Entrance Antiphon:

We should glory in the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, in whom is our salvation, life and resurrection, through whom we are saved and delivered.

First reading: Numbers 21:4-9

When those that were afflicted looked upon it, they were healed.

On the way through the wilderness the people lost patience. They spoke against God and against Moses, 'Why did you bring us out of Egypt to die in this wilderness? For there is neither bread nor water here; we are sick of this unsatisfying food.'

At this God sent fiery serpents among the people; their bite brought death to many in Israel. The people came and said to Moses, 'We have sinned by speaking against the Lord and against you. Intercede for us with the Lord to save us from these serpents.' Moses interceded for the people, and the Lord answered him, 'Make a fiery serpent and put it on a standard. If anyone is bitten and looks at it, he shall live.' So Moses fashioned a bronze serpent which he put on a standard, and if anyone was bitten by a serpent, he looked at the bronze serpent and lived.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 77:1-2, 34-38

R: Do not forget the works of the Lord!

Give heed, my people, to my teaching; turn your ear to the words of my mouth. I will open my mouth in a parable and reveal hidden lessons of the past. R

When he slew them then they would seek him, return and seek him in earnest.

They would remember that God was their rock, God the Most High their redeemer.

But the words they spoke were mere flattery; they lied to him with their lips. For their hearts were not truly with him; they were not faithful to his covenant.

Yet he who is full of compassion forgave them their sin and spared them. So often he held back his anger when he might have stirred up his rage.

He humbled himself, therefore God had exalted him.

he was humbler yet,
even to accepting death,
death on a cross.
But God raised him high
and gave him the name
which is above all other names
so that all beings
in the heavens, on earth and in the underworld,
should bend the knee at the name of Jesus
and that every tongue should acclaim
Jesus Christ as Lord,
to the glory of God the Father.

Alleluia, Alleluia!

We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you, because by your cross you have redeemed the world.

The Son of Man must be lifted up.

Jesus said to Nicodemus:


