ALL SOULS' DAY

Sunday, 2 November 2025

"IF WE LIVE, WE LIVE FOR THE LORD; AND IF WE DIE, WE DIE FOR THE LORD. SO, WHETHER WE LIVE OR DIE, WE BELONG TO THE LORD".

(ROMANS 14:8)

The feast of All Souls gives us an opportunity to reflect on WHY we pray for the dead, why it is important for us as a Church to do so, and how facing the reality of death helps us clarify our faith. Most of us would recall how the devotion to the Holy Souls was very popular. People offered Masses for the Holy Souls. On All Souls Day each Priest offered three Masses, people came in great numbers for the Masses, and they visited the Church often during the day to gain indulgences by their prayers. Even today they offer Mass for their loved ones on their anniversary, birthday, Christmas and Easter. Sadly, however, prayer for the Holy Souls is not as popular as in times past. Halloween, trick or treat is perpetuated and that is what excites the young generation today. It is sad that this significant day is not imprinted in the minds of many people in the developed countries.

If I were to ask what is the best thing you can do for a loved one who has died, what would you say? A funeral to talk about them? A nice grave and headstone? A tree, plant or a beautiful flower? Have a wonderful reception? Yes, all those things are nice. But the best gift is prayer because that is the only thing that can help them on their journey to the Lord. Someone has written in his will, "Please don't spend time talking about me, spend time praying for me." Monica, the mother of St Augustine said at her deathbed, "bury me anywhere but, remember me at the Altar, for, it is a holy and wholesome thing to pray for the dead that they may be loosed from their bondages and enter into the everlasting place where 'there will be no sorrow, pain, but only joy and happiness".

Praying for the dead is important for us as a Church. It unites us before God, and reminds us that our lives, here and now, are important. What we do matters. What the Church does matters. God has given us a community, fortified by Word and Sacrament, that, through baptism, is united with Christ in his death and resurrection.

Finally, anyone who has faced the death of someone they love has had to look at their own faith. It is often at the time of loss that we ask ourselves hard questions about our own lives, and the faith that sustains us. We know that death is real. Today's feast gives us the opportunity to reflect on the greater reality of heaven. Jesus is trustworthy when he promises that "everyone who sees the Son and believes in him may have eternal life, and I shall raise him on the last day."

"Her husband had died a few years before, and she had a young son who was born just before his father's death. One day when her son was at a neighbour's house, she suddenly sensed her husband was speaking to her. He seemed to be telling her that their son was drowning in a swimming pool. She ran next door to the neighbour's and found her son drowning in the pool, exactly as she sensed her husband telling her. She pulled her son out of the pool, just in time to save his life".

Why does this story move us so deeply? A story about a child's life being saved is certainly moving, but this story contains something more. A dead father is still there for his child, at the moment when he is needed most.

As we profess in our Creed, we believe in the Communion of Saints and in doing so and praying for our departed sisters and brothers, we recognize that we are still connected, that we are still a community. Though we are separated by the physical world, we are still united spiritually. And the celebration of the Holy Souls enables us to live in faith and hope that death is not the final word but resurrection.

This Sunday's Readings



Entrance Antiphon:

Just as Jesus died and has risen again, so through Jesus God will bring with him those who have fallen asleep; and as in Adam all die, so also in Christ will all be brought to life.

First reading: Isaiah 25:6-9

The Lord will destroy Death for ever.

On this mountain, the Lord of hosts will prepare for all peoples a banquet of rich food. On this mountain he will remove the mourning veil covering all peoples, and the shroud enwrapping all nations, he will destroy Death for ever. The Lord God will wipe away the tears from every cheek; he will take away his people's shame everywhere on earth, for the Lord has said so. That day, it will be said: See, this is our God in whom we hoped for salvation; the Lord is the one in whom we hoped. We exult and we rejoice that he has saved us.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 26:1, 4, 7-9, 13-14 R: The Lord is my light and my salvation.

The Lord is my light and my help; whom shall I fear?
The Lord is the stronghold of my life; before whom shall I shrink?

There is one thing I ask of the Lord, for this I long, to live in the house of the Lord, all the days of my life, to savour the sweetness of the Lord, to behold his temple. R

O Lord, hear my voice when I call; have mercy and answer. It is your face, O Lord, that I seek; hide not your face. R

I am sure I shall see the Lord's goodness in the land of the living, Hope in him, hold firm and take heart. Hope in the Lord! Gospel: Roman 5:5-11

Having been justified by his blood, he will be saved from God's anger through him.

Hope is not deceptive, because the love of God has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit which has been given to us. We were still helpless when at his appointed moment Christ died for sinful men. It is not easy to die even for a good man - though of course for someone really worthy, a man might be prepared to die - but what proves that God loves us is that Christ died for us while we were still sinners. Having died to make us righteous, is it likely that he would now fail to save us from God's anger? When we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, we were still enemies; now that we have been reconciled, surely we may count on being saved by the life of his Son? Not merely because we have been reconciled but because we are filled with joyful trust in God, through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have already gained our reconciliation.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia!

This is the will of my Father, says the Lord, that I should lose nothing of all that he has given to me, and that I should raise it up on the last day.

Alleluia!

Gospel: Luke 7:11-17

Young man, I say to you, get up.

Jesus went to a town called Nain, accompanied by his disciples and a great number of people. When he was near the gate of the town it happened that a dead man was being carried out for burial, the only son of his mother, and she was a widow. And a considerable number of the townspeople were with her. When the Lord saw her he felt sorry for her. 'Do not cry' he said. Then he went up and put his hand on the bier and the bearers stood still, and he said, 'Young man, I tell you to get up.' And the dead man sat up and began to talk, and Jesus gave him to his mother. Everyone was filled with awe and praised God saying, 'A great prophet has appeared among us; God has visited his people.' And this opinion of him spread throughout Judaea and all over the countryside.

I am the Resurrection and the Life, says the Lord. Whoever believes in me, even though he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will not die for ever.
